Thomas O. Chesser is currently employed by Sano-Rubin Construction Company and is the Project Manager for the construction project being undertaken at the Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk Middle and High Schools. He also manages to work for the Gettysburg Flags Works as a construction contractor and owns his own general construction business.

While attending Columbia High School, Mr. Chesser was awarded an Edith Craig Reynolds Scholarship as well as a Worcester Polytechnic Institute Scholarship. His talents on the theatrical stage were recognized when he was designated as the Outstanding Senior Actor. The prestigious American Legion Award was granted to him in recognition of "outstanding qualities, of honor, courage, scholarship, leadership and service". After graduation from Columbia High School, he went on to receive a B. S. in mechanical engineering at Worcester Polytechnic Institute, Worcester, Massachusetts.

Mr. Chesser's professional work experience in the engineering field is impressive to say the least. He has employed his considerable skills and talents in five states and for companies renowned for their accomplishments as follows: Power Technologies, Inc; Gardenway (Troybilt); Lockheed Martin (General Dynamics); General Electric Company (General Dynamics) and BMY, Defense Products (HARSCO). In each of these experiences, Tom Chesser was either a project leader, chief researcher and developer, or high-level administrator. Testimony to his critical contributions to his field of endeavor is his ownership of patents for chipper/shredder design.
